Richard Wilkinson (c.1872-1945) was proprietor of the Pioneer Printing Office, Yorketown, and editor of the Pioneer from 1917 until 1941. His brother, Ben. L. Wilkinson, had been editor before this since 1898T Richard Wilkinson started his career in newspapers in 1885 on a Port Adelaide paper, and worked as a journalist on the Pioneer for about five years before his brother resigned the editorship.)

This group reflects his interest in local history and shipping. It comprises magazine and newspaper articles, as well as photograph; collected during the period he was working on the Pioneer, but apparently arranged and listed mainly during his retirement.

Provenance Note

The group was originally accessioned as D3528 in 1956, and was donated by Mrs. R. Cosh.
