22. Jane and William Bakewell's home "*Shirley*" at Payneham, demolished during the 1970's. The man on the right is Carew Reynell, Jane's and William's grandson. William was the 1st. Crown Solicitor of Adelaide.

27. Rupert Reynell, M.D., F.R.C.P. Younger son of Walter and Emily Reynell, B.1884, D. 1948, Married Una Shaw Stewart. He went to Balliol College, Oxford, as a Rhodes Scholar in 1906. This photo was taken in the Laboratory at the Reynella Winery about 1902.
29. Carew Reynell, elder son of Walter and Emily. Carew managed the winery for his father until the 1914 war. He was a Lieut. Colonel with the 9th. Light Horse and was killed in action, Hill 60, Anzac, Gallipoli on 28 August 1915 (see "*With the Ninth Light Horse in the Great War*" by Major T.H. Darley). He was born in 1883 and married May Byard. His only son Flt. Lt. Richard Carew Reynell was in 43 Squadron R.A.F. during the 1939 war and was killed in action during the Battle of Britain on 7 Sept. 1940. (See "*The Hurricane Story*" by Paul Gallico, pages 32 & 95.)
31. Stephanie Blacker, nee Gumer, granddaughter of Jane and William Bakewell.
32. Picnic - occasion unknown. Standing L. to R. Lenore Reynell, Lydia Reynell, Olive Eversley Thomas (nee Ross Reid), Lucy Ross Reid (nee Reynell), Eversley Thomas, unknown, Rupert Reynell (in white hat), unknown, Walter Reynell (in top hat), Carew Reynell (in straw boater).
Sitting - 1st. on left Emily Reynell, Gladys Reynell (in straw boater and white blouse) and next to her on her right Raymond Owen - I do not know any of the others.
33. L. to R. Lucy Ross Reid (nee Reynell), Lydia Reynell, Walter Reynell.
34. Gladys Reynell (later Mrs. G. Osborne) artist and potter. B.1881, D.1956.

 47. This old house was just opposite the Happy Valley Reservoir overflow - note on back correct.

 61. 'Ruins of the first home built in Australia by Mr. Reynell', by R.E. Minchin, 17 Nov. 1868. Copied from water colour lent by Rev. and Mrs. P.P.A. Hopton. Verso of original bears the transcribed inscription, 'Lucy Reynell from her affectionate father - on her birthday. Reynella, 1 Apr. 1869. John Reynell'. Note by Mrs. Margaret Hopton (June 1984): 'Ruins of the first home built on section 524 at Reynella (then Hurtle Vale) by John Reynell in 1839. It was built of pise, with a shingle roof, six or seven rooms and a long verandah. It was known as the "Hall" and J.R.'s first child, Lucy, was born there. The Noarlunga Council is at present erecting a cairn on the site, which is marked by 4 stone pines planted by Walter Reynell.'
 62. Admiral Sir Charles Lucas in 1868. Son of Mary Reynell's brother, Davis Lucas. He was the first man to be awarded the V.C.
 63. Helen Bakewell. Mother of Donald Hankey.
 64. Emily Reynell, nee Bakewell, wife of Walter Reynell. She died when she was 38 of appendicitis while the 6th baby was on the way. Born 1851, died 1889.
 65. Lenore Reynell, daughter of Walter and Emily. Debutante, c.1898. Born 1878.
 66. Emily Reynell, daughter of Walter and Emily. Debutante, c.1898. Born 1880.
 67. Gladys Osborne, nee Reynell, daughter of Walter and Emily. Artist and potter. Born 1881, died 1956.
 68. Col. Carew Reynell, eldest son of Walter and Emily. 9th. Light Horse. Killed at Gallipoli, 28 Aug. 1915. Born 1883. Married May Byard, 1910. (See Maj. T.H. Darley *With the Ninth Light Horse in the Great War.*)
 69. Flt. Lt. Richard Carew Reynell, R.A.F. Sq. 43, 1940. Only son of Carew Reynell. Born 1912. Married Marjorie Watts Allen, 1938. Killed in the Battle of Britain, 7 Sep. 1940. On the Battle of Britain roll of honour, Westminster Abbey. (See Paul Gallico *The Hurricane Story*, pages 32, 95 and 142.)

70. Donald Hankey, 2nd. Lieut., 1st. Royal Warwickshire Regiment. (Here, in sergeant's uniform.) Donald Hankey (1882-1916) was a grandson of William and Jane Bakewell . His mother Helen Bakewell (sister of Walter Reynell's wife Emily) married Robert Hankey. Their 2nd. son Maurice, was Sir Maurice Hankey, Minister without portfolio, later 1st. Baron Hankey. Donald their third son was the author of "*A Student in Arms*" 2 vols. published 1916 and 1917, and "*The Lord of all Good Life*" published 1914. He was killed in action in France in 1916 also "*Letters of Donald Hankey*" was published in 1919 and "*Religion and Common Sense*" by D. Hankey pub. 1917 also "*The Story of Donald Hankey*" by K.G. Budd was published in 1931.
71. Rupert Reynell, M.D., F.R.C.P. second son of Walter and Emily. Rhodes Scholar c.1905. R.A.M.C. World Wars I and II. Senior Physician, West End Hospital for Nervous Diseases, London. Born 1884. Married Una Shaw Stewart, 1916. Died 1948.
