Henry Mildred (1795-1877) arrived in South Australia on 22 Apr4,1837 on the *South Australian* as an agent for the S.A. Company<sup>1</sup>. He became a member of the Adelaide City Council in 1841 and was active in public life generally.<sup>2</sup> In 1857 Henry Mildred was elected to the House of Assembly for the District of Noarlunga and was returned for East Torrens at the elections in 1860. From 1866-1871 he was a member of the Legislative Council.<sup>3</sup> In March 1858 he was appointed a member of the Central Road Board Committee<sup>4</sup> and was created a Special Magistrate in November 1858.<sup>5</sup>

Hiram Mildred (1823-1892), eldest son of Henry Mildred, preceded his father to South Australia on the brig *Rapid* in 1836<sup>6</sup>. After an early career as farmer, customs agent, gold seeker (Ballarat) and general agent, he was appointed as Sub-Collector of Customs at Port Elliot and Encounter Bay in 1858.<sup>7</sup> Until his retirement to North Adelaide in 1877 Hiram Mildred retained a variety of positions in Pt. Augusta (Sub-Collector of Customs, Harbour master, Superintendant of Mercantile Marine; Clerk of the Local Court, Chairman of the Destitute Board, District Registrar of Births, Deaths and Marriages, Secretary and Accountant of the North District Road Board) and was also active (with his wife) in the establishment of an Anglican Church and Sunday School.<sup>8</sup>

Florence Amelia Mildred was the daughter of Hiram Mildred.
