Miss Forwood was born at Mile End South Australia on 30th December 1887. She was the eighth child and youngest daughter of the late Walter Weech and Harriet Ann Forwood of Mile End and later Henley Beach.

Miss Forwood was awarded the medal of the Order of Australia in the General Division on 26th January 1981 for her assistance to and work for charity and for community service. She was a very generous donor to many charities over a long period of time and was very sympathetic and helpful to all appeals.

1860.
[Letter to his friend Mr G. Williams, High Street, Stepney, London. After enquiring about things in his former place of residence, Dr Forwood describes the voyage out in 1853, the search for suitable accommodation and a medical position, and his meeting George F. Angas at Angaston. Includes a typed transcript of the letter. The letter to Mr Williams was returned to Dr Forwood when he was back in London in 1863. An accompanying letter to Dr Forwoods's son W.W. Forwood from E.W. Bayley in 1908 mentions typescript copies being made of this letter].

[Diaries or journals: 1"Renown" barque, on which W.W. Forwood travelled to Java, Singapore, China, Japan and arrival in England 13 April 1864.

Continuation of diary of journey in first diary, plus details of other trips in South Australia (Talisker mine, and Goolwa,) and a log of return voyage to South Australia in clipper ship "City of Adelaide" pasted into the volume (on blue paper), 6 August 1864-23 September (1864). The end of volume has a narrative of part of his trip as deck hand on the "Renown" in 1864 based on the diary entry.

Diary covering part of voyage to China in 1863, his stay in London and return on "City of Adelaide" his start in engineering and diary of various events in his life, marriage etc, and his visit, with some of his family, to England in 1908 as a Commissioner to the Franco-British Exhibition.
