Rectangular full-length portrait, in clerical robes. The Adelaide Photographic company, Neales Buildings, King William Street, Adelaide, H Davis, Proprietor (1868-78).
83. William Frederick Marshall, Diocese of Adelaide (1869-1889) then Western Australia from 1890 to 1924. Rectangular, full-length sepia photograph of a young man in knee-length high buttoned coat. The Adelaide Photographic Company, H Davis (Manager) Neales Buildings, King William Street Adelaide, under the Patronage of the Governor Rt Hon Sir James Fergusson [1869-72].
84. Edmund Augustus Jenkins, Acting Headmaster of St Peter's College (1852-1854), then Second Master (1854-55). Incumbent Kensington (1855-88). Carte-de-visite shield shaped sepia photo of head and shoulders, top-buttoned coat and wearing a cross. Mr John Hood, Miniature Painter and Photographer, Glenelg [1869-83].
85. Henry Martyn Pollitt, Hon Canon of Adelaide 1896-1904, in ministry in South Australia 1865-1904. Carte-de-visite, oval sepia head and shoulders portrait, No. 40062. T Duryea Photographer, 66 & 68 King William Street, Adelaide [under the patronage of several governors, including Sir James Fergusson, 1869-72].
